PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT (2009–2010)

As this is to be my last President's Report to members of the Queanbeyan & District Dog Training Club, I would like to take the opportunity to briefly summarise the Club's progression since being elected your President some five years ago.

Our Club was formed in the early 1990s and up until mid 2006 our weekly training sessions were being held on the Queanbeyan Showground on Tuesday evenings. A general type course training syllabus existed and new members tended to be accepted more or less on a come as you arrive basis. During this earlier period of the Club's history, our currently leased training grounds on the Hoover Reserve were being developed for future usage.

When Committee made the decision in late 2006 to relocate our training sessions to the Hoover Reserve, there was quite a fair bit of trepidation being expressed by many of our members at the time. Just to name a few of these concerns included the unruly state of the grounds (*quite a lot of bindii infestation, long grass etc*); lack of facilities such as (*no shelters, toilets, car park, water or lighting*). All this, as well as changing training times from Tuesday evenings to Sunday mornings, made this period extremely challenging.

Although this initial transition period was quite stressful, it was very rewarding for all those involved. In that regard, my personal thanks must go to the support, initiative, foresight and downright physical assistance made by a great bunch of staunch members, instructors and some fantastic committees.

This assistance, together with the support received from the Queanbeyan council, I believe our Club has now overcome the bulk of those early reservations:

- Our grounds are sprayed annually by Queanbeyan City Council to assist in eradicating noxious weeds and the bulk of the grass seed infestation from the surrounding open areas on the Reserve;
- Our extremely large car park area was developed, levelled, packed, graded and covered with granite and stone fill;
- Grounds maintenance and beautification programs have been achieved by regular mowing (*with a great deal of assistance from Council & members alike*) as well as planting a variety of native trees and bushes. (*Currently the state of our grounds are the envy of many members from the other dog training clubs around the ACT district*);
- As no permanent structures are permitted to be erected on our leased grounds, the Club purchased two vandal proof cargo containers, which were placed close to our training grounds and are currently being used for both administration, shelter and temporary equipment facilities;
- Transportable toilet block facilities were obtained and connected to the main sewerage lines (*Please note that all these costs were generously covered by our local Queanbeyan City Council*);
- Roofing was obtained and erected over the two containers by a group of DIY members;
- The existing watering system on the grounds was greatly improved and updated to make it a much more usage asset, especially during those hot summer months;
- An easy to read bi-annual week by week training syllabus was developed; placed on our web-site for perusal by prospective members; and is being used for all classes;
- Instructor training courses are now being conducted on an annual basis, which means our Club no longer has to rely that much on assistance given by instructors from ACT training clubs;
- New intakes and renewals are now fully co-ordinated with instructor availability; and

- Electronic enrolment forms and relevant Q&A information letters relating to our Club's training syllabus etc are being sent to all new prospective members.

Believe me, this is no time for the Club to sit on its laurels because there is still a great deal that needs to be achieved by future committees, such as:

- Examining the feasibility of installing electricity to our grounds. When this is achieved, it could then enable evening training classes to be conducted, particularly during those hot summer months;
- Expanding training classes to include many of the other 'dog related' activities such as agility, dog dancing, flyball;
- Upgrading our storage shed (*adjacent to the Archery Club building*), which has sadly been neglected for the past few years, to make it a much more usable asset to the Club;
- Exploring the possibility of implementing Phase II to the grounds; and
- Continuing to modernise, upgrade and implement the necessary training equipment needed by the Club.

The Club's has just recently introduced the new 'Recreational Class' and together with the decision that the 'Instructor to Dog' ratio for any class should not exceed '10:1', I am very confident that our little 'dog training school' has become a much more enjoyable experience for both handlers and their best friends.

The Club now has clear written guidelines relating to the recommended duties of committee members; membership intakes; renewal notices; instructor rosters and courses; training classes; security aspects; keys register; trials and assessment day guidelines. For the bulk of these improvements, my personal thanks must primarily go to our Club's very hard working Secretary (*Jacqui*) who has been ably assisted by many past and current members.

As you will note from the Treasurer's Report to the AGM, our Club is in a very stable financial position which should assist in all future developments to our Club.

Our instructors never cease to amaze me with their diligence to all given tasks and the manner in which they implement the Club's training syllabuses. It is very pleasing to see our instructors passing on their personal knowledge and experience to members at whatever class they are taking.

In conclusion, during my term as President of your Club, I have been extremely fortunate with the quality of support and assistance that past and present committee members, instructors and members have given to me. This period has been probably the most enjoyable, comfortable and memorable period I've experienced over my forty odd years of involvement in the dog obedience training world.

I'm extremely confident that should the quality of volunteers attending the Club continue to be maintained in the future, it can only go from strength to strength and will always be an organisation for which each and everyone of us is proud to be a member.

During the year we have had many visitors to our meetings one of these was Brian Parker, Vice President of Dogs S.A.

During the year the Committee authorised Richard Herba to purchase a BBQ, which has had a good workout over the past few months. The Committee is also in the process of purchasing a Club Banner to replace the old one which is starting to look worn.

LEASE ON GROUNDS

Once again the Queanbeyan Council has given the Club a rebate on the cost of our lease.

MEMBERSHIP

For the year 2009 -2010 our membership was 194. Reminder letters were again sent to members and the response has been very good.

ARF asked the Club if foster carers could be given a discount on membership and training fees. The Committee decided that foster carers be allowed to train multiple dogs per year after paying membership and one training fee. Official documentation that they are foster carers must be sighted.

TRIAL

Our trial which was held in July was a great success with many positive comments from competitors and the judges. This year the ACT Gundog Society held a Gundog Working Test in conjunction with our trial and the feedback from them was also very positive.

Thanks must go to our Trial Manager, Chris Motbey and Assistant Trial Manager, Michael Ziebell, who took the reins from Chris on the day of the trial as she was overseas.

Congratulations to our members who have been successfully trialling throughout the year.

The Committee is in the process of looking into holding 2 Obedience Trials in the future, in conjunction with one of the other clubs in our area. The Committee is also looking at holding an Agility Trial perhaps next year with the help of the other training clubs in our area.

Thanks to Terry Griffin for building new obedience trial equipment, which was ready for our July trial.

GROUNDNS

This year a façade has been erected on the front and back of the roof between the two containers. A big thank you to our working men: Richard Herba; John Douglas and Terry Griffin.

Signs are being made to go around the perimeter of the grounds saying “Private Property for members only”.



Walking On-Leash

Teach your dog not to pull while you are both standing still. Hold the leash firmly with both hands and refuse to budge until your dog slackens the leash. Not a single step! It doesn't matter how long it takes. Just hold on tight and ignore every leash-lunge.

Eventually your dog will stop pulling and sit. As soon as he sits, say "Good dog," offer a food treat, and then take just one large step forward and stand still again. Hold on tight; your dog will likely explode to the end of the leash, thereby illustrating the reinforcing nature of allowing your dog to pull for just a single step.

Wait for your dog to stop pulling again (it will not take as long this time). Repeat this sequence until your dog walks calmly forward (because he knows you are only going one step) and sits quickly when you stop and stand still.

Your dog quickly learns he has the power to make you stop and to make you go. If he tightens the leash, you stop. But if he slackens the leash and sits, you take a step.

After a series of single steps and standstills without pulling, try taking two steps at a time. Then go for three steps, then five, eight, twelve, and so on. Now you will find your dog will walk attentively on a loose leash and sit automatically whenever you stop. And the only words you have said are "Good dog."

Alternate heeling and walking on-leash. For most of the walk, let your dog range and sniff on a loose leash, but every 25 yards or so, have your dog sit, heel, and sit, and then walk on again.


