

SCOOP THE POOP



You are required to clean up after your dog if it defecates on Club grounds

You can be prepared, wherever you go, by arming yourself with a small plastic bag or two. Simply put your hand inside the bag, scoop up the offending pile, reverse your hand out of the bag and tie the neck of the bag. Then dispose of thoughtfully.

Dog Aggression Workshop/Seminar

On the 17-18 August, the club supported eight instructors; Christiane Weissbach, Karen Jenkins, Jodie Moore, Rhonda Daley, Jan Loose, John Bernardi, Vanessa Tuckfield and Karen Roberts, to participate in a training workshop/seminar on "Dog Aggression", to learn more about dogs that display aggression towards other animals/dogs or people. The workshop was taught by Sidney Aarons, who is an expert in canine behaviour using the most modern canine applied psychology, utilised over 21 years training thousands of dogs for private and government agencies.

The two day workshop/seminar covered the following aspects:

- Explanation of Sidney's straight-line system
- How dog aggression is created
- Training equipment
- Correct use of impulse control
- Why, how and when to use positive reinforcement
- Identification of different types of agression
- Why dogs are reactive to other dog's on-leash but not off-leash

The workshop/seminar enabled the instructors to take their dogs and apply techniques learned in practice.

Meet the Instructor: Vanessa Tuckfield

Vanessa can be seen at the grounds on Sundays teaching Beginners and Intermediate and was previously the lovely and helpful person you would find in our Shop.

How long have you been training your dog(s)?

I have had dogs all my life, but we started bringing our dogs to QDDTC about 10 years ago, my daughter Zoe, got a new puppy and we wanted her to learn good handling skills, now many years later and 2 dogs trained through QDDTC, we still come every week, both Kelsi and Jazy love their time in Recreation class.

What do you like most about training your dog(s)?

I love the relationship between handler and dog. Both Kelsi and Jazy have different personalities but we all work so well together. I just love working with the dogs and seeing them succeed.

What has been the best bit of advice you've received about dog training and why?

In a family home, consistency is probably the best advice we got early on, every family member using the same commands and ensuring the dogs behave the same way for all of us.

Why did you decide to be an instructor?

I wanted people to build the relationship with their dogs that our family have with our dogs. I love to see people succeed with their dogs, you really can see a twinkle in their eye, when both are working well together.

What is your biggest challenge as an instructor?

Small dogs, co-ordinating the smaller steps, and bending lower to treat just creates a different dynamic that I am not used to.

How do you spend your time with your dog when it's not Sunday morning?

Our dogs are older now, so it's not about the long walks anymore, they love to cuddle on the couch. We also spend time practicing our training, it's about lots of small moments that add up into a well behaved, confident dog.
