

YOUR FIRST OBEDIENCE & RALLY TRIAL

The decision to enter your first trial should be the culmination of sufficient training to ensure that competing is a happy and rewarding experience. These factors will help:

- 1. to be in touch with current ANKC Obedience Rules
- 2. you have trained you dog to the best of your ability
- 3. you have run through the exercises under mock trial conditions at your local dog obedience training club
- 4. join the websites used by clubs for electronic entry to their trials. The two most common are Easydog and Showmanager. Once joined, your and your dog s details are maintained and electrically propagate any trial/show entry you may choose to enter. These sites also allow for electronic payment for the trial/show.

What the judge is looking for:

- 1. enjoyment and willingness to work; fear and dislike of work shall be penalised
- 2. gentle and smooth handling
- 3. a handler shall give a command once only, except in the case of the command Heel which may be repeated to the dog each time the judge tells the handler to go forward
- 4. talking to the dog by the handler, snapping of fingers, slapping of sides and stamping of feet must be penalised
- 5. during the Heel routines, the handler must walk briskly with the dog at the left side. In the Heel on Lead exercise, the leash must be completely loose. Guiding the dog by means of the leash is penalised
- 6. the dog must not anticipate the handler s commands but must wait for commands

A very good opportunity to either enter or observe a trial is coming up with the Club's annual all breeds dog obedience trial being held on <u>Saturday 10 July</u> at our Hoover Road Club Grounds in Queanbeyan.

If you are in Community Companion Dog (CCD) level or higher, your dog may be trained well enough to participate. Ask your Instructor for an informal assessment. The CCD competition format and exercises are similar to the Club's CCD class.

What you need to do to enter the Club trial:

be a financial member of Dogs NSW (if you live in another State be a financial member of its Canine Association) the State body which oversees the running of each Club's trials;

have your dog registered with the appropriate section of Dogs NSW (if you live in another State be a financial member of its Canine Association) - (cross breed and non-pedigree dogs are included on the Associate Register). Your dog will get a unique number to identify him/her and record any passes at obedience trials;

complete an online entry using the website indicated in the club advertisement.

If you want to have a look at dogs doing formal obedience trialling where they can gain ANKC recognised obedience titles, come along on the day, or volunteer to help out.

If you leave the ring as if you have won the class, your dog will never know or care

How long have you been training your dog?

Abby and I have been members of the club for 2 1/2 years now, from Beginners through to Advanced. I must admit it did take us three goes to pass Advanced.



We now enjoy going to the Recreation classes each Sunday. We are continuing to grow and learn something new each week.

What do you like most about training your dog?

When I look down at Abby during training or socialising and she is looking at me, focused on what I want her to do next. Makes me so proud.

I love the bond that develops overtime between and your best mate when you are training.

It is so nice to hear people say to you what a well-behaved dog , when I m walking, asking her to wait outside the coffee shop, sitting beside me when chatting to someone. It makes training on those cold winter mornings so worthwhile.

What has been the best bit of advice you ve received about dog training and why?

All the advice has been great advice. I think the best advice I have received is that training is continuous, it never stops. Abby and I are learning all the time, especially me.

CLUB PERPETUAL AWARDS

Queanbeyan and District Dog Training Club hands out Perpetual Awards to its members at the end of each training year. The club s awards encourage and acknowledge effort and excellence in club activities and ANKC sanctioned activities that reflect well upon the club and club members.

Evaluation for awards is on performances over at least three of the four terms in the evaluation period, with each evaluation period commencing with Term 4 of the year preceding the award year, and Terms 1, 2, and 3 of the award year. This allows time for the committee to finalise decisions on awards and prepare trophies for presentation at the end of Term 4.

Instructors nominate members for the Annual Awards on performance categories as follows, which is presented to the Committee for discussion and final nomination:

Best Gentleman Handler and Best Lady Handler

Presented to a gentleman handler and a lady handler who during the year have:

- shown outstanding handling skills in training;
- regularly attended training at the club during the year; and
- not received a title award from the club during the year.

Best Junior Handler

Presented to a junior handler (under 16) who has regularly attended classes and has made significant progress in training their dog during the year.

Most Improved

Presented to the handler and dog team that has shown significant improvement (which may be evidenced by assessment scores throughout the year) in training during the year through the dedication and commitment of the handler. The interaction and relationship between the dog and handler is an important consideration.

Encouragement Award

Presented to the handler and dog team that has overcome difficulties (whether personal or dog related), and shown dedication and commitment to training and has made commendable progress during the year.
