



MEET A MEMBER – MARGY WYLDE-BROWNE

I am originally from New Zealand and I can remember the dogs we had were always considered very important members of our family. As an adult I have had three of my own dogs and each subsequent one has had more training than the last. Having a dog in my life makes me feel complete!

How long have you been training your dog?

Frankie the Cavadoodle (Labrador, Cavalier and Poodle Cross) arrived at 8 weeks old in late August 2021. Training started then and there and hasn't stopped.



What do you like most about training your dog?

The challenge of training, me I think! And also how it is building trust in my relationship with Frankie.

What has been the best bit of advice you've received about dog training and why?

Frankie's breeder, Kate, is a vet and she really stressed the importance of socialisation for puppies between 8-16 weeks. Kate said the probability of puppies getting parvovirus in Canberra was very low vs them being isolated and poorly socialised. So we got out every day for those critical weeks meeting countless dogs and people and I think the results are evident in how Frankie is very friendly and relaxed with everyone.

Why did you decide to train with Queanbeyan & District Dog Training Club?

Frankie arrived in lockdown and it was very hard to find a dog club to be part of, so I put our names down at a few places. We ended up getting into a couple of clubs so for a while during 2022 we were training at two different clubs! In the end I choose Queanbeyan over a club much closer to home. I love the laid back caring, family, non pretentious vibe at our club!

What do you see is your biggest reward with training your dog?

That others love having Frankie over because on the whole she has pretty good manners and is so friendly. Also importantly on the whole I can trust Frankie to do what I ask her.

How do you spend your time with your dog when it's not Sunday morning?

We have a routine of walking on Mount Ainslie and running around the Majura oval. Frankie loves playing with other dogs and her favourite game is chasies. I still work from home three days a week and I observe Frankie does heaps of sleeping. The other two days when I am at the office Frankie goes to dog day care and she plays all day long and comes home totally exhausted.
