<b>Recreation Weeks 26+</b>		This special class is open to dogs that have achieved the Advanced Class Level and the handler wants to continue training their dog but does not want to participate in the trialling level classes. As there is no laid down training syllabus for this class, the week by week training structure is left up to the class instructor. It's considered that the class would continue to do heel work, recalls, examinations, stays, retrieves and distance control exercises as well as some other dog related exercises as Rally-O, Agility, and even Fly Ball training. This means that there would be NO further need for any future assessments to be carried out for dogs participating in this class.											
<b>Rally Weeks 26+</b>		This special class is open to dogs that have achieved the Intermediate Class Level and the handler wants to continue training their dog but does not want to participate in the trialling level classes. As there is no laid down training syllabus for this class, the week by week training structure is left up to the class instructor. It's considered that the class would continue to do heel work, recalls, examinations, stays, retrieves and distance control exercises as well as some other dog related exercises as Rally. This means that there would be NO further need for any future assessments to be carried out for dogs participating in this class.
